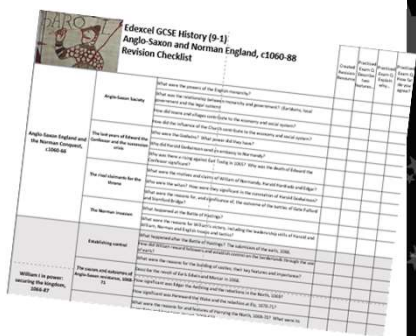

1918	1. Kaiser Wilhelm abdicates throne.	Dolchstoos	'stab in the back' theory.
1918	Armistice signed ending First World War.	Constitution	A set of rules for Weimar Germany
1919	Spartacist Uprising / First Weimar elections.	Republic	A country ruled only by a parliament
1919	Treaty of Versailles signed.	Article 48	Gave German President special powers
1920	Epp Putsch.	Proportional Representation	Each political party was given a % of seats in parliament equal to the % of vote. Allowed extreme parties power.
1923	Occupation of the Ruhr and Hyperinflation.	Coalition government	Many parties had to work together in parliament, making them weaker
1923	Gustav Stresemann appointed Chancellor.	Right - Wing	Believed in nationalism and authority.
1923	New currency – The Rentenmark – introduced.	Left - Wing	Supported workers rights / communism.
1923	Locarno Pact – Germany accepts borders.	Freikorps	Ex - army soldiers who kept weapons.
1923	Germany joins League of Nations.		
1929	Young Plan – restructures reparations payments.
